Your photo package includes evening and morning shoots, so you have the cranes coming and going. And because your blind is so close to the roosting birds on the river, you'll need to stay put and overnight in the blind. We'll drop you off around 5 p.m. in the evening and pick you up the next morning around 9:30 a.m.

Important Details About Our Photo-Video Blinds

This experience is not for everyone. The photo-video blinds are placed in close proximity to known sandhill crane roosts on the river. For that reason, you are required to spend the night in the viewing blind, as it will be impossible to leave the blind without disturbing the birds. But what you give up in creature comforts, you'll more than make up for in spectacular evening and morning views.

Photo-video blinds are constructed of plywood and are built for a maximum occupancy of two adults. The 8'x6'x4' blinds have an open floor and are not heated. As such, you should be prepared for difficult weather conditions. A latrine pail serves as the toilet facility, so you'll need to be comfortable with your viewing partner.

Cold Weather Camping

The weather in Nebraska in March is unpredictable. Overnight temperatures are often quite cold. Participants should be prepared for cold and changing conditions. The following list of equipment is highly recommended:

- Sleeping bag rated to at least -10° F or a lesser sleeping bag with wool blanket
- Ground pad
- Warm hat
- Several pairs of insulated socks
- Winter boots
- Winter gloves
- Thermal underwear
- Water bottle
- Chemical hand/feet warmers and heat wraps
- Food

Other Program Rules and Instructions

- Arrive at the Crane Trust Nature & Visitor Center by 4:30 p.m. to meet your guide.
- Your guide will transport you to your blind.
- Your guide will review emergency response, communication and evacuation procedures.
- A latrine pail will be provided.
- All other light sources are prohibited.
- Dark clothing or camouflage is required.
- No heaters or stoves.
- No alcoholic beverages or smoking allowed.

Camera Gear

- 300mm lens minimum (the longer the better)
- Extra batteries
- Tripods are allowed
- Weather protection for gear
- Remember the screen on the back of your camera lights up your face. Please duck out of sight to eliminate the possibility of the light disturbing the wildlife while reviewing images.
